FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

OVERVIEW

This year, the Jack Trottier Foundation reached significant financial milestones. With a total revenue of \$543,000, we achieved an impressive 12.91% increase compared to the previous year. Key fundraising efforts, including the Falmouth Road Race and our annual Cornhole Tournament, contributed \$66,000 to this success.

In addition to monetary donations, the foundation received major contributions, including event space, event supplies and marketing support. The McGovern Automotive Group continued as a sponsor for the third consecutive year, and the **Tyngsboro Sports Center** hosted the Cornhole Tournament. Additionally, Big Night Live and Flecha Azul Tequila were major donors for our Storytellers Premiere event. Major donors contributing over included \$10.000 the **Travis** Rov Foundation, the Cleveland Foundation. and Nordson Medical.


Our commitment to supporting individuals' quality of life remained strong, as we awarded \$125,000 in grants. Additionally, invested \$30,300 in advanced recreation therapy programming, fostering innovative opportunities for inclusive activities. Education also remained cornerstone of our mission, with \$55,718 dedicated to empowering our community through knowledge and skill-building.



- Advancing Grant Funding Efforts: Assisting in researching and expanding grant funding opportunities, enabling the foundation to secure resources that directly support our three program areas.







This year, the Jack Trottier Foundation proudly expanded its programming to include SCI education. A highlight of this new initiative was the launch of the **Kindness Matters** campaign at Tyngsboro Elementary School, aimed at fostering SCI awareness among youth. The campaign featured a t-shirt design contest, which was won by third grader Paityn, whose creative design captured the spirit of the campaign.

Additionally, the foundation introduced the **Storytellers** docu-series, beginning with **Volume One: Jake Thibeault.** The series debuted with a trailer launch party on October 19th at Spyglass Brewing Company, followed by a full documentary premiere at Big Night Live in Boston on November 19th.

The film expresses the profound and often unseen challenges faced by individuals at the beginning of an uphill journey with paralysis. Through intimate interviews, films can capture the resilience, daily personal triumphs of those struggles, and navigating life with an SCI. It highlights the innovative therapies and support systems that are transforming lives, while also shedding light on the emotional and psychological impact of such injuries. Storytellers films aim to inspire and educate, offering a poignant look at human strength and the relentless pursuit of independence and quality of life. Storytellers is much more than a story. It's a chance to learn, prepare, assess, and find gratitude. In an effort to promote a positive outlook for individuals newly navigating life with SCI, and to encourage accessibility, inclusivity, and injury the foundation began prevention, screenings of the documentary to local healthcare centers, schools, and businesses.

"I am incredibly grateful to have the WHILL wheelchair. Not only is it incredibly stylish, sleek, and lightweight, but it also disassembles; which gives me the flexibility to make last-minute changes in my plans. As a full-time power chair user, I don't take that for granted. Another thing I love about this chair is its adjustable height. I've been too tall for all of the foldable power chairs that I've tried, so it's nice to be able to adjust this chair to my liking."

"This life-changing experience has changed my perspective on my injury as a whole. Being surrounded by so much joy and such a diverse set of people has taught me so much about how I can pivot and live a long life as a person with a spinal cord injury. I had never been skiing even before my injury and being able to try this as open my eyes to an entire new sport."




FUTURE OUTLOOK
